Your application will be reviewed within 2 weeks. After your application has been reviewed, you will receive one of three replies:

You have been accepted provided that you meet certain conditions, for example, you still need to achieve a sufficient level of English and/or you hand in a copy of your diploma later. Once you meet these conditions, you should contact us immediately with proof of meeting the conditions and we will then send you an unconditional offer letter.

REJECTION

We are sorry but we cannot accept you into the course. Your application will go no further for this course.

Please be aware that changes in preference is not allowed after 1st of June 2018. Each consortium partner retains the right to withdraw their programme before May 15th if their student quota is not met. Applicants will receive official notice of such a decision and will be offered an alternative.

We require you to have two referees who can vouch for your academic abilities, personality and suitability for the course you have applied for. Your referee may be a teacher, head teacher, employer or anyone not related to you but in a position of professional authority.

Important Information for applicants:

- Your referees should be people not related to you by blood or marriage.
- Your referees should be qualified to comment on your academic ability or employment performance.
- Reference letters must be submitted on official letterhead and must be signed by the referee.

Important Information for referees:

- Please address the letter to the Geert Hofstede Consortium.
- Reference letters must be submitted on official letterhead and must be signed.
- Please include the name of the applicant and the programme applied for.
- Please include your name, position/status, address, telephone number, and email address.

Please use the following guidelines in completing a reference:

- What do you consider to be his/her main strengths.
- Please include detailed information on the results obtained by the applicant or prediction of likely results if the applicant has not yet completed their programme of study.

- Please comment on English language proficiency – ability to speak, write and comprehend English, if the applicant's native language is not English.
